Weatherstripping for Winter

With winter just a couple of months away, it may not be a bad idea to check the foam strips in all your exterior door jambs. These strips are easily removed and replaced. They are susceptible to being chewed on. Crickets and grasshoppers are usually the culprits, and sometimes a dog scratching to get in will destroy them as well.

First of all, most of the strips have the same profile. They have about 1/2" compression when the door is closed and are about 1/2" thick when the door is open. You can find replacement strips at Home Depot or Lowe's.

Start by getting a pair of pliers and gripping the top or bottom of the weatherstrip and s-l-o-w-l-y pulling it out of the slot in the door jamb.

When you have taken all the strips off, check the length of the new strips you have already purchased and cut them to length to match the old ones. Start the weatherstrip flange into the slot in the door jamb and continue to press it into place from top to bottom on the door Do all three strips, being iamb. careful to press the weatherstrip flange completely into the slot. A screwdriver may aid you in securing a proper installation. Try using the handle to press the weatherstrip into place- not the business end of the screwdriver as this may damage the new weatherstrip material.

While you're at it, you may as well adjust your door threshold at the same time. It's adjustable with a slot screwdriver and just a small turn will usually do it. First check

Emergency Services District Proposed

An Emergency Services District (ESD) has been proposed for the Elgin-McDade area. Emergency Service Districts taxing are authorities that are governed by a board of elected or appointed The taxing commissioners. authority is used to raise money to support emergency medical and fire services.

The ESD proposed for our area would have a board of five elected commissioners. These commissioners would be responsible for holding public hearings and setting the tax rate between one and ten cents per one hundred dollars valuation.

The proposed ESD would increase the revenue available to the fire departments that serve the Arbors allowing the departments to buy better equipment to serve the growing population in this part of the county. Without the revenue generated by the ESD, the local fire departments, manned solely by volunteers, may not have the resources or equipment to respond to a serious fire in our neighborhood.

With improved equipment come another bonus-lower insurance rates. Areas are rated based on the ability of a fire department to respond to a fire. A large part of that response involves capable machinery, such as fire trucks. The ESD will allow local fire departments to purchase new trucks in addition to other fire fighting paraphernalia, such as radios and fire suits. The goal of the department is to lower the current rating by at least two points, which could save property owners as much as twenty percent on insurance.

There will be a public meeting discussing the proposed ESD on November 2, 2006 at 7 p.m. in the Elgin ISD Administration Building. The Elgin ISD Administration Building is located on North Avenue C just east of Eleventh Street. To get there, take Hwy. 95 to Elgin and turn left on Hwy. 290; turn right on Eleventh Street (the stop light by the HEB); go to the second four-way stop and turn right, the Administration Building will be on the right past the house that is on the corner.

if you can see any light under the door when it is closed. A flashlight at night usually works best. If you can't see any light, take a dollar bill and place it over the threshold and close the door. Pull the bill out. If there is some resistance the threshold is OK. If it comes out easily, the threshold needs to be adjusted. Turn the screws in your threshold the same amount. That is if you turn one screw 1/4 of a turn, turn all the screws approximately the same. Try the door again until you get the resistance when you try to remove the dollar bill.



Arbors Website Adds Forum

The Arbors web site has added a user forum. A forum is like a public bulletin board where user can post messages and discuss topics of interest with others. Users can post on a wide range of topics but must agree to the rules set up by the Board regarding use of the forum. These rules are on the forum itself under the "Admin" link.

Go to the Arbors web site (arborsia. org) and click on the Forum option on the left side of the window. You can view any of the postings without registering but to post something

you must become a registered user. To become a registered user simply click the "Register" link fount at the top of the page under "The Arbors at Dogwood Creek" title.

You will then need to agreee to the Registration Agreement Terms and then fill out a registration form. The forum requires you to submit only three items: a user name (nickname), email address, and password. After submitting the registration form the forum administrator will e-mail you to let you know that your user account has been set up.
