### Bits From the Board

Thanks to those of you who were able to attend the Annual Meeting in August. During the meeting, the Welcome Committee handed out a Ouestionnaire for the Community's suggestions feedback on improvement to the Arbors. I will answer as many as space will allow in this part of the newsletter. Others we may answer in the next newsletter or as part of the community forum in the next monthly Board meeting and post the answers in the Arbors Website.

- 1. Park Improvements: Pool—discussed a couple of years ago and we decided that there was too much liability involved. Build a community center for meetings, etc.—the Board discussed this occasion and thinks it may be a good idea. We need to investigate building costs and tax impact. I believe we have the expertise within the Arbors to minimize costs.
- 2. Speed bumps near Park—more NO votes than yes. Although there still are many that are driving faster than they should be in the

Arbors. More stop signs by the Park will be installed soon.

- 3. Change monthly meeting day—The Bank is fairly booked for the room we are currently using. The Board has asked those attending on Wednesday night about their flexibility in changing the meeting and we believe that we would lose more folks than we would gain.
- 4. Enough notice for Community events—YES
- 5. Information Arbors Newsletter—Most are happy with the content. Some suggestions have been implemented (Community Achievements. children's activities. upcoming Some suggested events). a listing of Violations. We may have to do a somewhat generic listing due privacy issues.

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### **ACC Continues Compliance Goals**

Voluntary compliance with the CC&Rs and approved Board policies continues to be the goal and focus of the ACC for 2006. For more information regarding the CC&Rs, Board policies and to view the Community Review Items Outline, please visit the Improvement Association web site www.arborsia.org.

Now that autumn has officially arrived, owners should be reminded that, as leaves fall from trees, yard visibility increases. Many of the friendly reminder letters, warning notices and fine invoices sent to owners pertain to issues created when items are visible from any Arbors street. Appropriate and pleasing views from our streets are important to the community as a whole.

Over the past several months, examples of some of the issues that have created letters to owners are:

 Required screening of utility storage tanks [water, propane etc.] when the tank is visible from any street

- Travel, horse, cargo and utility trailers parked on driveways and in yards when visible from any street
- Dead trees and tree limbs [cut or broken] in a part of the yard visible from the street
- Piles of landscape material [dirt, mulch, rocks, bricks, gravel, etc.] covered or uncovered, bagged or unbagged visible from the street for more than 30 days
- Constructed fences with cross lumber and support [metal or wood] visible from the street

While not a complete listing of all that is reviewed by the ACC, it is easy to see the theme of the items reviewed and the desire to maintain our community using high Please keep in mind, standards. that in the event you receive a letter, the ACC is not out spoil your fun. Please give some thought to how you could have avoided getting a letter. Finish that project timelier? Place the item[s] behind your fence? Build or plant screening materials? Please remember that voluntary compliance is the community goal.

## **Maintenance Committee Update**

#### **Gate Operator Replacement**

The Arbors' board has approved the replacement of the North Gate operators with new commercial quality ones. The operators are the mechanisms that open and close the gates as well as control their functionality. These operators are the same brand and model as the ones used in the South upgrade/renovation. Gate This will simplify maintenance and programming for years to come.

Work on this project is scheduled to begin the week of October 17-21. This is not a firm date, but we will try to give at least 24 hours notice

of any gate closures during the North Gate Brick Repair replacement procedure.

This project does not include new gates. Resident's should only notice two things after completion of this project. 1) The gates will operate faster and more efficiently; and 2) The gates will be closed when they are supposed to be closed. The same remote control openers that work now will work with the new operators. The gates will also be equipped with backup batteries. If there is a power failure, the backups are programmed to open the gates and keep them open until the power is restored.

In August there was a slight mishap involving a moving vehicle and the north gate entrance. The good news is that no one was injured and the entrance was only slightly damaged. Additionally, the driver's insurance will cover the cost of repairs.

The delay in the repair has been caused by the difficulty in locating the correct used bricks in sufficient quantity. It is possible to reclaim some of the bricks from the fallen

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### **Survey Says**

A survey covering many issues facing the association was conducted at the annual meeting this year. Questions ranged from traffic issues to social events.

Suggested improvements for the park included a pool, a club house or gym, and better park maintenance. Residents overwhelmingly favored changing the stop sign by the park into a 4-way stop but did not like the idea of speed bumps.

Several residents expressed concerns regarding the gates. A few residents wanted the gates to remain closed and some believed that the timing of the gate closing should be reviewed. Other security issues brought up by residents included a neighborhood watch, no solicitation rules, speed limits, and a security guard.

Another issue addressed in the survey was the monthly meeting. Of the respondents, half said they would attend if the meetings were on another night. When asked to specify a day that worked best the responses ranged through the entire week without a consensus. Many property owners had a scheduling conflict which kept them from attending meetings such as work, church, or non-residency.

While generally approved, the AIA Newsletter received several suggestions. Residents wanted more information about violations of the

deed restrictions, members that are past due with their association dues and board activities. A few also wanted more local news and more about AIA activities.

When asked about solicitation in the neighborhood, an overwhelming majority of residents were in favor of prohibiting door-to-door solicitations in the Arbors. A few favored this prohibition with exceptions for school fund raisers.

The Fall/Spring Garage sales were approved of by most respondents. A few would prefer none and some felt that they should be allowed any time.

Most respondents wanted to see more organized activities in the Current social activities. Park. Fall Fest, Santa in the Park, the Adult Valentines Party, and 4th of July, were approved of by all respondents. Some residents would like to see more craft activities for children in the park. Community events, such as National Night Out, should be continued and more events should be planned. Members also expressed an interest in more social activities like block parties, pot lucks, or volleyball tournaments.

Several residents expressed interest in organizing or participating in dinner groups, play groups, card parties, tennis groups or hobby groups.

column, but labor costs and the high rate of breakage makes this only a good backup plan.


We have located a used brick from Mississippi that resembles our brick so closely it will be difficult to tell the difference. Look for the repairs to begin on the entrance by late October into early November.

#### **Erosion Control**

Earlier this year, the maintenance committee undertook the repair of the most highly eroded drainage easements in the Arbors. The drainage easements are the grassy areas that extend 15' from the edge of the roads. Most of the erosion was caused by the displacement of the ground cover by various means. With the fine sand exposed, it is easily removed by wind and rainwater runoff.

One of the greatest contributing factors to our erosion problem is damage caused by driving vehicles on or across the drainage easements. Vehicles displace the ground cover and create ruts in the sand that accelerate the erosive effects of water runoff.

The solution is simple. Please don't drive or park on the grass in the drainage easements. There is about 12" of roadbed that extends past the asphalt. It is ok to park on this roadbed, but not any farther.
